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Background

- 3. On 25 September 2024, Cabinet Social Outcomes Committee:
 - a. directed officials from Crown response agencies, led by the Crown Response Unit, to develop a plan to respond to the Royal Commission of inquiry into Historical Abuse in State Care and in the care of Faith-based Institutions (the Royal Commission) for joint Ministers by the end of 2024; and

- b. invited the Lead Coordination Minister for the Government's Response to the Royal Commission's Report into Historical Abuse in State Care and in the Care of Faith-based Institutions to report back to Cabinet Social Outcomes Committee with the plan by early 2025 [SOU-24 Min-0188 refers].
- 4. Crown response agencies have been working with the Crown Response Office to develop a plan that can respond to all 208 recommendations directed to Government from the Royal Commission.

Crown response agencies have developed an approach to the response that will combine a strategic outcomes focus with recommendation-level reporting

- 5. The Full Response Plan maps all 208 recommendations (that require Government action) across 38 work packages, which sit under eleven action areas and three high level objectives. The objectives are based on action areas identified by the Royal Commission in its final report, Whanaketia.
- 6. Grouping the recommendations into work packages is intended to help manage their complexity and number and will support the phasing of the Government response. Reporting will still be able to measure progress at a recommendation level.

The papers attached to this briefing are multiple, complex and detailed

- 7. The papers attached to this briefing are multiple, complex and detailed. This is representative of the complexity of the work to respond to the Royal Commission. They are the product of months of work across multiple agencies to consider both the broad issues and system shifts recommended by the Royal Commission, and its more detailed and highly specific recommendations. It is important that Government develop an approach that can do justice to both the years of work the Royal Commission put into developing its many reports and the thousands of survivors of abuse and neglect whose suffering is reflected in those reports.
- 8. The papers attached to this briefing are for your information, feedback and decision. The table at Appendix One is intended to help guide you through them and references the specific papers and paragraphs within them. All but the last of these papers are intended to be appended to the Cabinet paper. The papers are as follows:
 - a. a draft Cabinet paper Abuse in Care Inquiry: Full Response Plan (April 2025) for discussion at SOU on 9 April 2025. This paper provides a working draft of the Abuse in Care Inquiry Response Plan (the Response Plan) and seeks decisions needed to finalise the plan, including approaches to engagement, monitoring and reporting.
 - b. a draft Response Plan Background and Context. This document contains information on the Royal Commission reports, the Government's response to date, initial priorities for the next phase of the response work and approaches to engagement, monitoring, oversight and reporting.
 - c. a draft Detailed Response Plan (working draft). This document groups all 208 recommendations that require Government action into 38 work packages that sit under 11 action areas and three high-level objectives: addressing the wrongs of the past, making the care system safe and empowering those in care, their families, whānau and communities.

- d. a summary of the decisions on recommendations made to date (to accept, accept intent, partially accept or decline), the decision processes involved in making those decisions and recording the response, and the decision makers (for example, Cabinet, Ministerial, Chief Executive or authorised person decisions).
- e. a separate briefing on the scope of the Response Plan. This briefing seeks agreement to issues of scope that were raised at the joint Ministers meeting on 10 February 2025.

Next steps

- 9. Feedback received from Ministers will be incorporated into the papers. Further feedback will also be sought from agencies, and the paper will continue to be refined. They will also be edited, proofread and designed. Budget 2025 materials will be included when decided.
- Proactive release open and transparer 10. It is proposed to lodge the full Response Plan with Cabinet Office on 3 April 2025 for consideration by Cabinet Social Outcomes Committee at its meeting on 9 April 2025.
